

## January 2018 Kindergarten Happenings

Dear Students,

I'm writing this letter to you, instead of to your parents, as you are becoming such good readers already. Have you told your parents about our Sing and Spell Video? I'm so proud of the number of words you are reading. Report cards will be coming home January 9<sup>th</sup>. An explanation of this first grade card will be included in the envelope. Be sure to go over the skills marked, with your parents, and have them sign and return it as soon as possible.

Depending on number of snow days, I wanted you to know that we are hoping to hit our 100<sup>th</sup> Day of School this month. We will celebrate with a party. If you would like to send in 100 items for us to count, measure, or eat, we'd appreciate it. You can send in 100 cotton balls, 100 m&m's, 100 straws, 100 pennies, etc. Last year a student brought in 100 match box cars that lined the entire width of the classroom. January 18<sup>th</sup> might be the 100<sup>th</sup> Day, so let the countdown begin! Snow days could change this.
