We are finally getting into a routine and the students are well aware of what is expected in kindergarten. Learning to be a part of a group is sometimes difficult, but with the wonderful weather and inviting playground, we are trying very hard to follow the rules so we have more time to play.

Your child has worked with colors, shapes, counting, name recognition and now we fall into our letter weeks. If you'd like to send in a special low sugar snack to go along with our weekly theme, plan for 22 students in the class. It would be fun to have muffins for a special Friday snack the 22nd to celebrate "Mm" Week." We are excited to meet our first letter friend.

We will be having fun exploring with **magnets**, also, and it's a good time to teach your child about the danger of having magnets near computers. (\$\$\$\$\$)

Those of you with older children in our school corporation have been used to the "D'Nealian" Handwriting (slanted and tails). However, we started using the straight "ball and stick" printing with the kindergartners several years ago. Continue working with your child on printing the letters at home correctly. Thank you for seeing your child is taking her/his time printing neatly on the homework packs.

I have discovered that many of the children don't know their last name, names of parents or where their parents work. We will be checking again, in October, to see if the students can tell their full name, address and telephone number. This is homework you can work on together. Tying shoes is another important skill five- and six-year-olds need to master!
